The Royal Greenwich Changemakers
Challenge will run until the end of 2024!

It’ll be about raising awareness of decision makers locally and also influencing a range of decision makers, from councillor, mayors, MPs and candidates

The challenge will cover the following points:

Understand - Scouts will discuss what it means to have power and influence and be able to name people who have power or influence. They’ll then look at people who make decisions locally and what decisions they can make.

Manifesto - Scouts will read through the points in the Manifesto, evaluate them and write their own

Advocate - Scouts will take part in a troop forum with their leadership team and discuss what could be even better both for Scouts and their local area

Represent - Scouts will attend one of the District youth hustings and put their views as well as questions to Parliamentary candidates ahead of the general election.

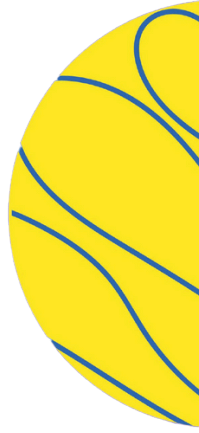

Have a discussion with Scouts about who has power locally, what powers they have and also who gave them the power and voted from them

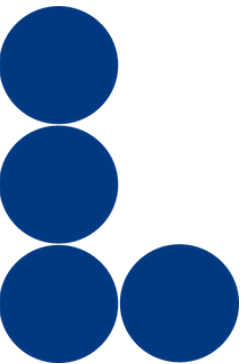

Draw a famous leader, write inside the leader what and who they lead, then on the outside write what qualities make them a good leader

Get the Scouts to research a local leader, can they create a fact file about that person? Find out what they stand for, who elected them and what they have done in their role

To achieve this part of the award you'll need to complete one of the below activities

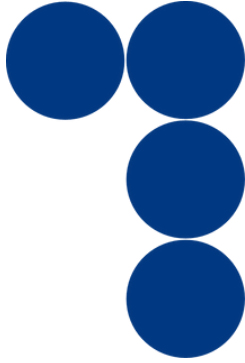

Advocate




To achieve this part of the award you'll need to complete one of the below activities

Have a discussion with Scouts as part of a troop forum on what they would like to change about Scouts to make it even better? How can local decision makers help with these changes




